### PALESTINE LAND EXERCISE

The war didn't start on October 7,  
and it won't stop until there is a Just Peace:  
the end of Israel's blockade of Gaza and illegal occupation of the West Bank



*The Palestine Land Exercise (PLE) is an experiential tool that traces the history of Palestinian – Israeli relations up to the current genocide.*



Join us from 12:30-3:00 on Sunday, May 31st, following worship and a pot-luck lunch to experience the PLE. Registration is limited to 30 participants. Please confirm your participation by filling in a registration form and placing it in the file on Anne's desk.

### **Palestine Land Exercise (PLE)- Sunday, May 31st, 12:30**

This is an educational tool that traces the history of Palestinian-Israeli relations up to the present genocide. The PLE uses large fabric maps listing historical towns and landmarks. As participants walk the "land" they learn about events and stories dating back over 100 years. Please join us **after worship for a pot-luck lunch** and then experience this very relevant interactive event. **Registration is necessary before May 27<sup>th</sup>**; forms are available on the table as you enter the sanctuary and can be placed in the folder provided.



**USED STAMPS:** If you have used stamps, you could drop them off in our mailbox or during office hours. Please make sure you leave a tiny margin around the stamp. We are now sending them to the Canadian Bible Society for their Stamps for Freedom Program. Stamps collected from donations across Canada are combined to create charity boxes and are sold to stamp collectors and vendors. The revenue generated from the stamps allows CBS to purchase Bibles for the Canadian prison ministry.
